On the Jewish festival of Pentecost, nearly 2,000 years ago the long awaited promise of the Holy Spirit was poured out on the church. Today, those who trust in Jesus Christ as their savior continue to enjoy the benefits of that great gift. The Spirit of God is what gives us power to follow Jesus, to repent of sin, to love God and our neighbor. As Christians, we must know that what we are commanded to do is impossible without God's ongoing work by His Spirit.

FIRST LESSON

Acts 2:1-11

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!"

SECOND LESSON

I Corinthians 12:4-13

There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all men.

Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. To one there is given through the Spirit the message of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and He gives them to each one, just as He determines.

The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all its parts are many, they form one body. So it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free, and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.

Music Notes

Today's music for Pentecost—music about the Holy Spirit—comes to us with a decidedly Lutheran flavor. The offering anthem is the opening movement from a Pentecost cantata written in 1725 by **Johann Sebastian Bach**. The text—sung in an English translation—is John 14:23, in which Jesus foretells the gift of the Holy Spirit: he and the Father will "make our home among them" that love him and keep his word. Luther's hymn on the Holy Spirit, **Komm, heiliger Geist, Herre Gott** – "Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord," (see text on p. 14 above) is heard twice during today's service. The prelude is a lyrical and contemplative setting by the north German organist **Dietrich Buxtehude**. Later in the service, the choir sings a setting by **Johann Hermann Schein**, who was one of Bach's predecessors as organist at the St. Thomas Church in Leipzig. This arrangement for voices and instruments is known as a sacred concerto (*geistliche Konzert*), a genre that would develop into the cantatas Bach would write a century later.
